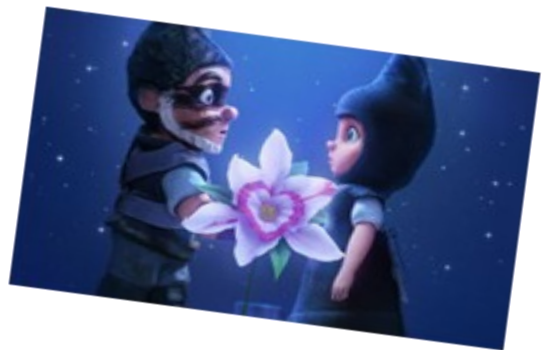
CHILDREN'S MOVIE NIGHT

- Approved Land Use Permit – Rafael Mejia – Repair existing seawall.
- Approved to extend contract with Nowlen, Holt & Miner, P.A. as the accounting firm for the Town for a period of one (1) year with no change in rates.
- Approved the annual renewal of contract with AECOM for Utilities Engineering Services with no change in rates.
- Approved the annual renewal of contract with Engenuity Group Inc. as Town Consultant Engineers with no change in rates.
- Approved the agreement with Joseph Iagrossi, Construction Inspections of the Palm Beaches, Inc. to serve as Building Official from October 1, 2011 to September 30, 2012. New agreement removes rates charged for plan reviews on new construction, additions and remodels.


At the September 6, 2011 Town Council Meeting The Following Action Was Taken:

- Approved the Minutes of the August 9, 2011 Second Budget Workshop.
- Approved the Minutes of the August 9, 2011 Town Council Meeting.
- Approved Proclamation recognizing and expressing support for the 10th Anniversary of 9/11 National Day of Service and Remembrance.
- Approved the agreement with Caldwell, Pacetti, Edwards, Schoech & Viator, LLP as Town Attorney.
- Approved the agreement with Clarke Aquatic Services doing business as Aquatic Weed Technology to provide services from October 1, 2011 until September 30, 2012.
- Approved the contract with Land Research Management, Inc. for yearly Comprehensive Plan Amendment update.
- Approved the Professional Services Contract with Burton & Associates Inc. to perform FY 2011 Water/Wastewater Revenue Sufficiency Analysis Update.
- Approved the Forfeiture Expenditure in the amount of \$5,660.09 for the Police Department purchase of eight (8) I-Pad 2's to be used in both Emergency Operations Centers (Police EOC & Town Hall EOC) and in the field during storm recovery and/or other emergency situations.
- Approved the Forfeiture Expenditure in the amount of \$2,726.83 for the Police Department purchase of a ticket writer for the motorcycle used by the Lake Clarke Shores Police Department.
- Approved the proposal from Southwide in the amount of \$4,180.45 to cover costs to install thermoplastic pavement markings and reflective pavement markers along certain sections of the roadways in Town, with the money to be transferred from unappropriated funds to General Fund Roads & Streets.

HALLOWEEN HEALTH AND SAFETY TIPS

- S** Swords, knives, and similar costume accessories should be short, soft, and flexible
 - A** Avoid trick-or-treating alone. Walk in groups or with a trusted adult.
 - F** Fasten reflective tape to costumes and bags to help drivers see you.
 - E** Examine all treats for choking hazards and tampering before eating them. Limit the amount of treats you eat.
 - H** Hold a flashlight while trick-or-treating to help you see and others see you
 - A** Always test make-up in a small area first. Remove it before bedtime to prevent skin and eye irritation.
 - L** Look both ways before crossing the street. Use established crosswalks wherever possible.
 - L** Lower your risk for serious eye injury by not wearing decorative contact lenses.
 - O** Only walk on sidewalks or on the far edge of the road facing traffic to stay safe.
 - W** Wear well-fitting masks, costumes, and shoes to avoid blocked vision, trips, and falls.
 - E** Eat only factory-wrapped treats. Avoid eating homemade treats unless you know the cook well.
 - E** Enter homes only if you're with a trusted adult. Otherwise, stay outside.
 - N** Never walk near lit candles or luminaries. Be sure to wear flame-resistant costumes.

Crime Alert!

There's a trend being used by criminals where an unsolicited call is made claiming that a resident has won a large sum of money, (usually \$50,000.00 to \$60,000.00) and/or a new luxury vehicle.

The caller will entice the resident by asking what color he or she would like for the vehicle and if the resident will be at home for delivery the next day. Because a "900" or equivalent telephone number is used, a follow-up call to the "caller's" number will cost the victim for each minute of the phone call. This is how they make their money. An official from a phone company indicated that these "callers" have obtained social security numbers, bank pin numbers and even bank account numbers from residents.

Residents should be aware of callers claiming to be from a "prize type" organization claiming that they have won something big. These are "Too good to be true" types of scams that originate usually from overseas. This method is popular over the Internet. Residents are asked to **never give out personal information** until they verify the call is bonafide. Residents should report any suspicious calls or incidents to the police department.

Recycling Information

In 2010, the Solid Waste Authority (SWA) Governing Board implemented a Recycling Revenue Share Program with partnering municipalities to strengthen participation and increase the amount of materials recovered.

As a result of the outstanding recycling efforts by our residents, the Town of Lake Clarke Shores has received \$15,250.25 since the program was implemented in fiscal year 2010.

Through our cooperative partnership, the Town has recycled 419.06 tons of material which helps to conserve valuable landfill space and natural resources. This amounts to 572 lbs per household.

511 Provides Time-Saving Traffic Information to South Florida

The Florida Department of Transportation's (FDOT) free 511 service provides real-time traffic information for major roadways in South Florida. Travelers can dial 511 to access current information on all major roadways including, I-95, I-595, I-75, Florida's Turnpike and US-1. Available travel information includes anticipated travel delays, traffic accidents, roadway blockages and lane closures. It also allows callers to access airport, public transportation and seaport information within South Florida.

Before heading out, users can log onto www.511SouthFlorida.com to access traffic cameras, incident reports and sign up for personalized email alerts, incident reports and personalized email alerts.

511 FEATURES

- Available 24 hours a day
- Toll free call with voice-activated menus
- Compatible with cell phones and landlines
- Current traffic information for select area roadway and roadway segments
- Event information including schedules for major concerts or sports events
- Public safety alerts
- Access to regional and Statewide 511 system

In the event of an evacuation or other emergency, FDOT recommends drivers call 511 to check on highway and bridge conditions. Florida's 511 service provides up-to-the-minute information on toll suspensions, road closures, and evacuation routes.

At Memorial Park!**



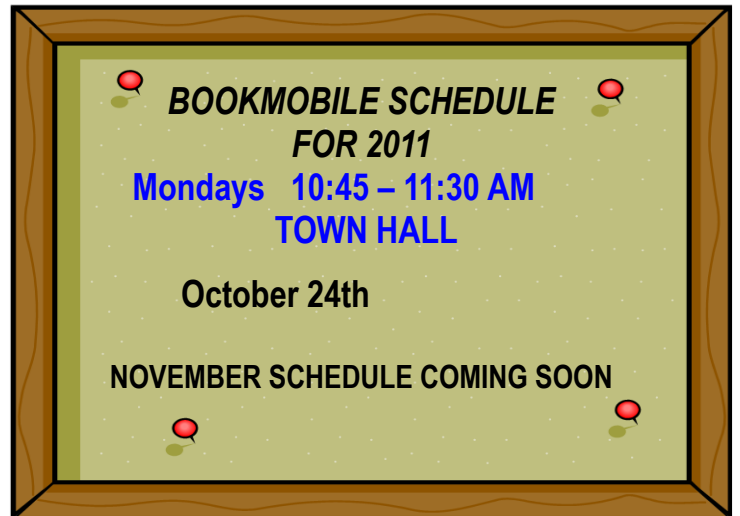
